Connecting Your Wise Account

4. Sign in to your Wise account.

After the authorization is complete, your account is ready to use Wise for eligible affiliate payouts.

After connecting your Wise account, eligible affiliate commissions can follow a structured payment workflow. Commissions are first calculated according to your affiliate program settings before becoming available for payment.

Keep Your Wise Balance Funded

Automation does not remove the need to maintain sufficient funds in your Wise account. Before payment day, verify that your available balance is high enough to cover every approved affiliate commission.

Regularly checking your balance helps avoid delayed payouts and keeps your affiliate program running smoothly.

Best Practices for Automated Affiliate Payments

A reliable payment system builds confidence among your affiliates. When commissions are paid accurately and on time, affiliates are more likely to continue promoting your products and recommend your affiliate program to others.

- Maintain sufficient funds in your Wise account.
- Review affiliate commissions before each payout cycle.
- Verify affiliate payment details regularly.
- Monitor failed or pending transactions.
- Notify affiliates when payments have been processed.

- Keep your affiliate program rules transparent.

Recommendation

Even when payments are automated, it's a good practice to periodically review your payout reports to ensure every transaction has been completed successfully.

Security Recommendations

Because affiliate payments involve financial information, protecting your accounts should always be a priority. Use strong passwords, enable two-factor authentication whenever available and regularly review your account activity.

Common Issues and Solutions

If an affiliate payment cannot be completed, the problem is usually related to incorrect banking information, insufficient account balance or a configuration issue.

- Verify the recipient's payment information.
- Confirm that your Wise balance is sufficient.
- Review your affiliate payout settings.
- Check whether the commission has completed its validation period.
- Reconnect your Wise account if authorization has expired.
